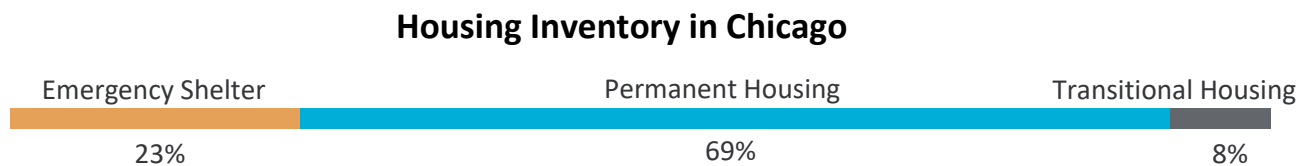


2020 Housing Inventory Count

16,936 Beds | **286 Projects** | **70 Agencies**

Background

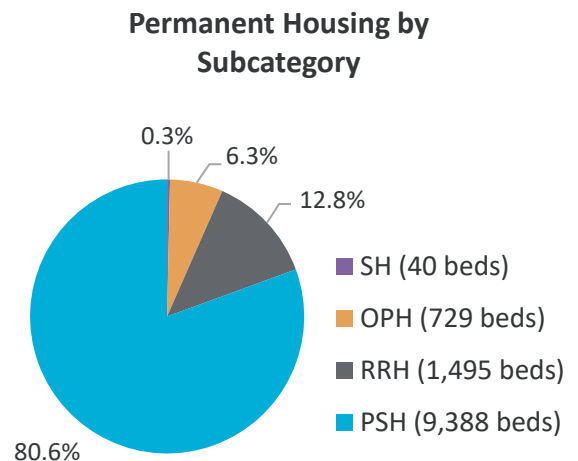
The annual Chicago Housing Inventory Count (HIC) is a count of housing projects within the Continuum of Care (CoC) that provide beds and units dedicated to serve people experiencing homelessness. The count was conducted in conjunction with the annual Point-in-Time (PIT) count on January 23, 2020. Results from both the HIC and PIT are submitted to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The **figure below** shows the total inventory divided by the number of beds in each project type – Emergency Shelter, Permanent Housing, and Transitional Housing.



Housing Inventory & Project Type Breakdown

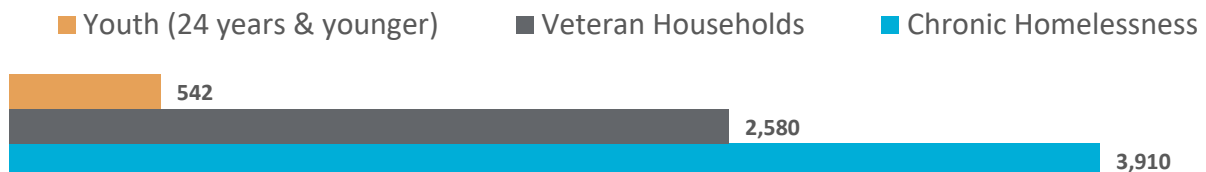
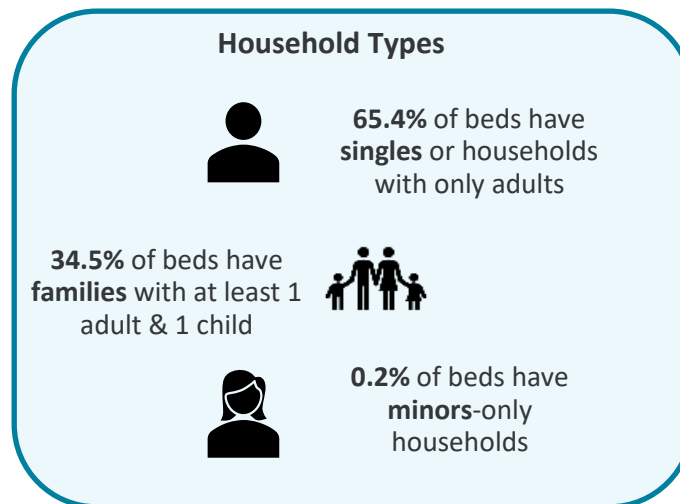
The **figure below left** lists the number of each type of project, separating permanent housing into its subcategories (PSH, OPH, RRH, SH). Read the program definitions in Chicago’s [Community Standards](#) and [Program Model Chart](#). The **figure below right** breaks out all permanent housing by the number of beds in each subcategory type.

Emergency Shelter (ES)	59
Transitional Housing (TH)	44
Rapid Re-Housing (RRH)	17
Other Permanent Housing (OPH)	13
Safe Haven (SH)	4



Household Types & Specific Populations

The **figure immediately below** includes all beds in the system divided by the household type occupying them: families (at least 1 adult and 1 child), singles or only adults (1 or more person 18 years-old or older), and unaccompanied minors only (1 or more person *under* 18 years-old). This figure is calculated from each project's report of the beds they have occupied by, or available to, each household type. In addition, projects report if they have beds dedicated to certain specific populations. The **second figure below** shows the total of these dedicated beds.
