Resource	Type of Information Located in the Resource
<a href="#">Ask A Question</a>	When a resource is not yet available for a question, it is helpful to send a question to HUD through the “Ask A Question” feature. This requires creating an account and logging in.
<a href="#">CoC FAQs</a>	This is a searchable database of the questions HUD receives frequently and the correlating responses.
<a href="#">CoC Program Interim Rule</a> . The HEARTH Act directs HUD to promulgate regulations for the Continuum of Care program. <a href="#">HEARTH Act</a> . The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act as amended by S. 896 The Homeless Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing (HEARTH) Act of 2009, enacted into law on May 20, 2009, consolidated the Supportive Housing Program, the Shelter Plus Care Program, and the Moderate Rehabilitation/Single Room Occupancy (SRO) program into a single grant program—the Continuum of Care Program.
